## **AUSTRIAN PINE (PINUS NIGRA)**

Grows 30-50 feet. Fast growing and is noted for its stiff, long green paired needles. Grows well in most soils. Resistant to pollution. Tolerates drought and temperature extremes. Origination "Austriaca" Germany. Tree sizes are approximate.

## BLACK HILL SPRUCE (PICEA GLAUCA DENSATA)

Grows over 35 feet. Short, stiff dark green needles and a spicy scent. Extremely hardy, withstanding heat and dry growing conditions. Used as ornamental, windbreak or as a Christmas tree. Origination: Black Hills, SD. Elevation 5500-6500 ft. Seed Zone #621. Tree sizes are approximate.

## **BLACK SPRUCE** (PICEA MARIANA)

An evergreen fir native to the northeastern United States and Canada. Growing upwards of 50 ft with short dark-green to blue-green needles. It is an excellent Christmas tree but may be used as a conifer in landscaping. Prefers well-drained, acidic, moist soil. Full to partial sun. Tree sizes are approximate.

Grows to 40-70 ft. Spreads 25-35 ft. Moist soil with good drainage. Shade tolerant. Can be pruned to maintain desired height. Lacy, graceful growth with yellow-green needles in spring changing to glossy green. Tree sizes are approximate.

## EASTERN ARBORVITAE (THUJA OCCIDENTALIS 'WHITE CEDAR')

Height: 30-40 feet – Width: 10-15 feet. Fan-like glossy leaves provide year-round color. Forms a wind tight barrier when used for screening or as hedging. Prefers heavy damp areas, but adapts well to other soil types. Tree sizes are approximate.

## EMERALD GREEN ARBORVITAE (THUJA OCCIDENTALIS 'SMARAGD')

Deep rich emerald green needles year-round. Naturally grows in a compact pyramidal form so pruning is rarely needed. Grows well in almost any well-drained soil and prefers full to partial sun. Will reach 8-10 ft. high, 2 ft. wide in about 10 years. Tree sizes are approximate.

## **DECIDUOUS TREES & SHRUBS**

BIRCH - NATIVE WHITE (BETULA PAPYRIFERA) "PAPER BIRCH"

Grows 50-70 ft. On young trees the bark is brown to bronze, but turns white as the tree ages. Tolerates alkaline soils well. Tree sizes are approximate.

BIRCH - WHITE (JAPANESE WHITE-PLATYPHYLLA JAPONICA)

Moderate to fast growth with a mature height up to 70 ft. Bark is tighter than Native White Birch – doesn't peel as readily. Birch-borer resistant. Moist, well-drained soil – full sun. Tree sizes are approximate.

CHERRY - BLACK (PRUNUS SEROTINA)

Grows 8-10 ft. Spreads 6-10 ft. A broad spreading shrub. Pink to white flowers followed by edible scarlet fruit in June. Foliage is a very attractive soft green. Tree sizes are approximate.

Grows 15 ft. A moderately rapid growing medium size tree. Densely branched and oval shaped. Blossoms snowy white. Dark olive green leaves. Fruit size 1/4-1/2" diameter. Excellent for windbreak and wildlife habitat. Tree sizes are approximate.

CRAB - RED SPLENDOR

(MALUS X RED SPLENDOR)

Grows 15-25 ft. Spreads 20 ft. Red flower buds open into large deep pink single flowers. The fruit is dark and showy. The foliage is dark reddish green in the summer, and turns a beautiful reddish purple in the fall. Upright spreading form. Tree sizes are approximate.

CRANBERRY - AMERICAN HIGHBUSH (VIBURNUM TRILOBUM)

Attractive foliage turns red and orange in the fall. Flat clusters of white flowers followed by red berries. Grows to 8 ft. Tree sizes are approximate.

Height and spread 5-12 ft. Fast growing small tree/shrub. Tolerates wide range of growing conditions. Small white flowers grow in large clusters in early summer followed by edible purplish black fruit. Attractive to birds. Tree sizes are approximate.

Small shrub often in clumps reaching 12 ft. in height. Edible brown nuts. Grows best in moist, well-drained soils but will adapt to most types of soils. Full sun or deep shade. Attracts wildlife such as deer, grouse, turkeys, pheasants & quail. Tree sizes are approximate.

## **CARING FOR TREES ON ARRIVAL**

- Bundles should be opened as soon as trees are received, and roots should be moistened. Plant the trees as soon as possible.
- If unable to plant upon receipt of trees, store in a cool area away from the sun and wind, loosen wrapping, and make sure trees are slightly moist by watering the paper/moss around the roots.
- DO NOT SOAK TREES IN BUCKETS OF WATER.
- When planting, either by hand planting bars or machine planting, be sure
  the roots are deeply secured in the ground and the soil around the tree
  is firmly packed.

## OAK BURR (QUERCUS MACRUCARPA)

Tolerates a variety of soil conditions. Leaf color is dark green in summer and yellow to yellowish brown in fall. Height 70-80 ft. Tree sizes are approximate.

## OAK - RED (QUERCUS RUBRA)

A wide, massive 80-90 ft. shade tree. Fast growing and long-lived oak. This acorn tree provides food and shelter for wildlife and can tolerate city conditions. Also commercially valuable to the lumber market. Tree sizes are approximate.

## **IMPROVE YOUR PLANTING SUCCESS**

# Following these simple steps will help improve your planting success:

- Site preparation. Your trees will get off to a better start if you spend time prior to planting reducing or removing grass, weeds and brush.
   If not controlled, these items can reduce the ability of the trees to take hold.
- Decide desired end result and determine quantity of trees needed.
   Christmas tree harvest: plant 6 ft. apart (1100-1200 trees per acre).

<u>Windbreaks:</u> plant 6-8 ft. apart. Divide the length of row desired by 6 or 8 and figure number of trees needed (12-16 trees per 100 linear feet).

Reforestation: plant 8-10 ft. apart (500-700 trees per acre).

<u>Ornamental plantings:</u> 4'x5' planting requires about 2,200 seedlings per acre. A 5'x5' planting requires about 1,700 seedlings per acre (1 acre = 43,560 sq. ft. – allow for access rows).

- Determine tree type. You must consider soil type, sun conditions, water drainage and other locational factors and match them with type of tree that thrives under those conditions. Not all trees do well under all conditions.
- Timing your planting. We suggest you try to schedule delivery so
  that you can plant your trees as soon as possible after their arrival.
  If you can't start planting upon arrival, store the trees in a cooler or
  other cool area out of the sun and wind. Open them slightly and make
  sure trees are slightly damp.
- Plant trees properly. Again plant your stock as soon as possible
  after receipt of trees. You can plant by hand using a heavy spade
  or spud, or you can use a machine. In either case, make sure the
  roots are deeply secured in the ground and the soil around the tree
  is firmly packed.
- Bigger seedlings and transplants with full root masses need special attention during planting. Nothing will save a tree that is poorly planted. Extra large seedlings and transplants need extra care due to their size.
- Site maintenance. Be sure to control weeds with herbicides and/ or mowing after planting. The weeds compete with the trees for nutrients, moisture and fertilizer and can affect their growth if not controlled. Discuss your options with your local chemical dealer.
- Harvest time. If you're planning to harvest your crop, keep in mind that
  natural occurrences (late frost, dry conditions, disease) can all affect
  growth rate. In general, the more care (fertilizer, weed/pest control,
  water) the trees receive, the sooner they'll grow to a harvestable size.
  The type of tree you select will also affect harvest time.

I am guessing with the record temps and countless days of no to very little rain this year has become a season of summer time sadness and countless hours watering and



moving around irrigation equipment. I don't believe we have had to use our big field irrigation guns and pivot on our Christmas tree fields this much in over ten years. I know the surrounding ag fields have had pivots running almost constantly. Even our neighboring two lakes that were over the berms and higher water lines in over thirty years have now lowered over 6 ft. and resorting back to marshes. Mother Nature is definitely unpredictable and I am thankful at least we aren't dealing with the fires that Canada is having.

We unfortunately will have extremely limited Nursery Stock to supply for 2024. The ripple effect of limited employees during the pandemic, environmental challenges, and extreme shortages on seed and products have taken their toll. I plan to up production this fall by putting in a larger amount of seed beds to make up for the tree shortages. Remember it takes the nursery a minimum of two-four years from seed to harvest. I would highly recommend placing orders as soon as possible for 2024 and in the spring putting in tentative orders for the spring of 2025. I am still hopeful for a typical fall that has cooler temps, and a normal winter without crop damage. Mostly I am looking forward to a fantastic "Mother Nature cooperating", spring harvest.

With already millions, upon millions, of trees planted from seed here at Laura's Lane Nursery we are officially celebrating 65 years in business. I look forward to the future and to supply you, our customers, with high quality, healthy, viable plants.
